George & Zoath & Tobias & Deborah given granted & confirmed and by these presents for the said Henry and Susan Bledsoe given grant and confirmed unto Abraham Bledsoe and William Bledsoe both of the County of Spotsylvania County and certain tract or parcel of land containing one thousand acres lying and being in the parish and County aforesaid and upon the bounded of the Main Run and bounded as followeth (to wit) **Beginning** at two white Oaks and a red Oak in a line of a patent granted to the Hon. Hugh Bushy lying on both sides the Main Run thence South Eighty five Degrees west one hundred eighty six poles to three white Oaks thence South forty Degrees west one hundred and fifty poles between two white Oaks near the head of a branch of the Black Walnut Run thence South East one hundred and twenty poles to three red Oaks near a branch of the Main Run thence South west one hundred and twenty poles to two white and a red Oaks thence South East one hundred and fifty poles to three white Oaks thence North Eighty five Degrees East two hundred and fifty poles to three red Oaks and a white Oak by the side of one of the main Run of the Main Run thence thence down the Run the several courses to the above said Hugh Bushy lying thence with his Line North one Degree west two hundred fifty five poles to the Beginning place **Witness** our hands and seals the 10th day of May 1748 and provided by the said Henry and Susan Bledsoe our heirs and assigns that the said Henry and Susan Bledsoe do give and sell unto the said Abraham Bledsoe and William Bledsoe under the seal of our said Colony the said land the day of May one thousand seven hundred and twenty six in the 20th Year of our said Majesty King George the Third

George & Zoath & Tobias & Deborah given granted and confirmed and by these presents for the said Henry and Susan Bledsoe given grant and confirmed unto Thomas Stanton of the County of Spotsylvania County and certain tract or parcel of land containing one thousand acres lying and being in the parish and County aforesaid and in the tract of the Appahamock River and bounded as followeth (to wit) **Beginning** at a red and white Oak standing by the side of the Appahamock River thence South Sixty Degrees west Eighty poles to a red Oak and Hickory thence West Northwest two hundred and twenty poles to a Hickory thence South fifty Degrees west two hundred and twenty poles to a Hickory and two white Oaks thence North Eighty Degrees west one hundred and fifty poles to two white Oaks and a white Oak thence South Sixty five Degrees west sixty eight poles to three red Oaks in a Valley thence North forty Degrees west eighty two poles to a white Oak thence west one hundred poles to four red Oaks thence South west seventy poles to a pine and two red Oaks thence South one Degree west one hundred and eighty poles to two red and a white Oak in Colons Neck woods thence thence with his Line North Eighty five Degrees west sixty poles to his house thence North fifty five Degrees west fifty two poles to a pine a white and red Oaks thence North twenty five Degrees west one hundred and ninety poles to a pine and two red Oaks thence North East two hundred fifty eight poles along George Kill to a white Oak and a white Oak in his Line thence South fifty Degrees

East two hundred thirty four poles to a white Oak stand North East two hundred
 and fifty poles to a red Oak stand North five degrees East two hundred and sixty
 poles to a Hickory stand Oak and Gum by the riverside toward down the
 River the several courses to the beginning place two hundred and fourteen
 three part three of being formerly granted to the said Thomas Stanton by patent
 dated the twenty second day of January 1717 North off wood under woods
 swamps Meads low grounds Meadows Hedging and low dunes that of
 all sorts of Meads and Quaints a well discovered as not discovered within the
 bounds aforesaid and being part of the said Quantity of one thousand acres
 of Land and the River water and water courses therein contained together with
 the privileges of Hunting Hawking Fishing Sporting and all other profits, liberties
 and Honors it amounts what so ever to the said or any part thereof belonging or
 in any wise appertaining **Tobacco** to possess and Enjoy the said tract
 or parcel of Land and all other the before granted premises and every part
 thereof with them and every of them appertaining unto the said Tho: Stanton
 and his Heirs and Assigns for ever &c. the only up and balance of the said
 said Thomas Stanton the bond and Assigns for ever **Tobacco** of one acre
 in free and common socage and not in Capite or by Knight's Service **yeilding**
paying (after the said first day of May one thousand seven hundred and
 twenty eight) unto the said Our Heirs and Successors for every fifty acres of Land
 (and so proportionably for a less or greater Quantity than fifty acres) the
 first rent of one shilling yearly to be paid upon the feast of St. Michael the
 Archangel the next Bullwarking and Improving the said acres parts every
 fifty of the tract above mentioned within the next year after the date of
 these presents (excepting for so much of the said Land as has already been
 improved according to the condition of the said former patent **provided**)
 always that if the next year of the said first rent shall at any time be in
 Arrear and unpaid or if the said Thomas Stanton his Heirs or Assigns
 do not within the space of the next year next coming after the date of these
 presents and improve the said acres part of every fifty of the tract
 above mentioned (except as before excepted) then the said Lands hereby granted
 shall be sold and conveyed to whomsoever the Heirs and Assigns shall think fit and may be
 lawful to and for us Our Heirs and Successors to grant the said Land and
 premises with the appertaining unto such other person or persons as we
 Our Heirs and Successors shall think fit **In witness** whereof
 we have caused these our Letters patents to be made **Witness** our
 Trusty and well beloved Hugh Drysdale Esq. our Lieut. Governour and
 in Chief of our said Colony and Dominion at Williamsburgh under
 the Seal of our said Colony the thirtieth day of May one thousand
 seven hundred and twenty six in the twelfth year of our said King
 Hugh Drysdale
