

Will Of William Triplett Dishman (1768-1833)

In the name of God Amen, I William Dishman of Westmoreland County, being (thank God) in good health and of sound mind & disposing memory but \_\_\_\_\_ certainty of human life do constitute this my last will and testament in manner & form following that is to say 1<sup>st</sup> I give to my son Samuel Dishman & his heirs the house in which he now lives together with ten acres of land attached thereto with improvements of all kind thereon. 2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my daughter Malissa Dishman one Bed, Bustles & furniture. 3<sup>rd</sup> The balance of my land, household, & kitchen furniture, all the stock of every description (after my debts are paid), I give equally to be divided between my daughter Lucinda & granddaughter Susan.

In witness whereof I have here unto set my hand & seal this 19 day of June 1833.
