

February 20, 1792 Slave guarantee papers from Samuel Dishman for his son Diggs Dishman

I Samuel Dishman Senior of Kings County, do authorize my son . . . Diggs Dishman to negro man named Benjamin, my property, and further, to give a Bill Sale for same which shall be good against all claims or demands whatsoever, given from under my hand this 20th February, 1792

Slave Receipt for Ben; March 2, 1792

This receipt, in conjunction with the February paper given Diggs Dishman by his father, were Joseph's receipt for his slave Benjamin. The receipt reads as follows:

Know all men by these presents that I? Diggs Dishman of the County of King Geo. have bargained and sold unto Joseph Rufner of Shannondoh County one negro man named Ben for the consideration of Sixty Pounds ? which I will warrant and defend against all claims and demands or whats ? given from my hand this 2nd day March 1792.
