1229 I have a copy of a document date Holston, VA Dec 22, 1896. It is to Mr. S. B. Dishman, Barboursville, KY from a John D. Dishman. In it he states "My great grandfather Wm Dishman emigrated from Scotland, and settled in Westmoreland Co Va. where he lived and died. He was the first and only Dishmant that ever came to this count. My Grandfather William Dishman heired the old homestead in Westmoreland Co. Va. where he lived and raised a family of children namely - John, Samuel, James, William, Charles and two daughters Nancy and Lucendia. Of this family William was my father. He moved from Westmorland, to Washington Co, VA. before the war of 1812 where he settled. Two of my father's brothers lived and died in Westmoreland Co. Va. His other two brothers Chas and Samuel moved away some where. I think Samuel settled in Maryland." "to the best of my knowledge that your great Grandfather must to have been my fathers brother, as the Dishman name originated from the one family only. If this be true, your grandfather and me are first cousins. One remarkable thing in the Dishman family is the name, John and William seems to be favorites and they have kept it up from generation to generation. Even in my own family I have three sons John William and James. I have a good many relations living in the Eastern part of this state....I will be 79 years old, do you see I as getting to be quite an old man"
