Fayette County, Kentucky, Deed Book U, pages 86 and 87

Know all men by these presents that we JANE DISHMAN<sup>851</sup> relic and widow of JAMES DISHMAN<sup>850</sup> deceased, and her son JAMES DISHMAN<sup>1098</sup>, and son in law LEMUEL JACKSON<sup>1448</sup>, who inter married with Jane late JANE DISHMAN<sup>1447</sup> for divers good reason us thereunto moving have and do by these presents ordain constitute and appoint our mutual friend and relation JOHN<sup>1099</sup> DISHMAN<sup>1099?</sup> our attorney in fact for us and in our names to sell and convey the interest we have as copardners of SAMUEL DISHMAN<sup>1443</sup> deceased in a house and lot in Lexington Kentucky and in a tract of land or an undivided interest therein in Fayette County, late the property of said Samuel deceased, and we more over authorite our said attorney to institute suit for the recovery of division of said property as to him may seem best and to liquidate, settle and adjust our claims of what nature soever with the administrator of said Samuel deceased to ask for and demand all monies due as aforesaid to grant receipts acquitances or other discharges therefore to [the word compound has been crossed out] compromise any conflicting or interfering claim in the adjustment of the business herein before mentiond and to do every other act in the premises which we our selves might do -- hereby ratifying the same in as full and ample a manner as if done by our selves in proper person, Witness our hands and seals in Simpson County County Kentucky this 15th day of September 1821. The words or any undivided interest therein first interlined.
